Course Purpose: The purpose of Elem 3000 is to provide future early childhood and elementary teachers with the ability to plan and implement art and music lessons to enrich all areas of the curriculum. A wide variety of materials and media will be reviewed, as well as basic learning and child development theory. This course illustrates the philosophy that school programs can teach academic content using the arts.

This course is on the required list of courses for the Childhood Education program at Auburn Montgomery and leads to Alabama teacher certification in both Elementary and Early Childhood Education (birth through grade 6). Students are prepared for a career in public, private, or home-schooling education. Students interested in other areas of study at the college level are welcome in this course; however, please consult a university advisor to determine if this course will satisfy elective requirements in other programs of interest.

General Information About Dual Enrollment

What is required to participate in Dual Enrollment?

- You must have completed your sophomore year of high school:
- You must have a high school GPA of 3.0 or above;
- You must have a minimum composite score of 20 on the ACT or 950 on the SAT;
- You must have permission from your high school and your parent or guardian.

How do I apply to participate in Dual Enrollment?

- Talk with your parents and your high school counselor about Dual Enrollment;
- Complete the online Application for Admission to AUM at www.aum.edu;
- Choose the **Dual Enrollment** applicant type in the drop down menu:
- Submit your official high school transcripts and ACT/SAT scores to AUM.

What are the costs for Dual Enrollment?

- As a dual enrollment participant, you are only required to pay tuition, no fees are required.
- Tuition will be \$100 per credit hour. This amount does not include your textbook(s).
- The tuition payment date for the Fall 2016 semester is August 08, 2016 and the payment date for the Spring 2017 semester will be in January 2017.

 - MyAUM account and pay through <u>Web Pay.</u>

Dual Enrollment students are subject to the same standards of conduct and academic achievement as other AUM students. Student's grades will be assigned by instructors and posted to an AUM transcript. What happens next? Complete a transcript permission form to have your high school transcript and test scores submitted to the Admissions Office. Once we have received all documents and determined the admission decision, we will notify you via mail regarding your admission decision and pertinent information. The Office of Admissions will assist with course registration. You will need to pay for your AUM course(s) by published payment deadlines. You can purchase books at the AUM Bookstore on campus.
